

## ST BENEDIC'TS PUPIL PREMIUM ALLOCATION/IMPACT 2015 – 2016

### **Background:**

Schools receive a payment, or Pupil Premium, for each child who is registered for free school meals (FSM) and for those who have been in continuous care for six months or more. From April 2013, the Pupil Premium was extended to include children who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. Schools also receive a payment for pupils whose parents are serving in the armed forces.

It is for school management to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for individual children at their school. (DfE website)

### **Barriers to educational achievement**

The main barriers for our children currently in receipt of Pupil Premium are:

- Experiential deprivation
- Limited access to educational enhancement activities
- Attendance
- Behaviour
- SEND cognition and learning difficulties
- Low aspirations

### **IMPACT**

#### **Enriching the Curriculum** £3,000

Eg History workshops, artists, subsidised visits

IMPACT: Contributions to these additional enrichment activities were made on behalf of families in financial need. All children were thus enabled to have equal access without the anxiety of financial pressure on their parents.

#### **Targeted support:**

Intervention work by teachers / teaching assistants (contribution) £32,600

IMPACT: we were able to offer a programme of targeted support and specific intervention programmes which enabled groups of children ie SEN / FSM to receive additional teaching to meet their needs.

#### **Extended School support:**

After school clubs / residential visits / Music lessons / Breakfast club for PP children £5,000

IMPACT: children experienced sports, activities and surroundings that they would otherwise not be able to access for financial reasons. There was also an impact on physical, social and/or spiritual

development as children challenged themselves and succeeded in adventurous outdoor situations. Children who were often late or had a chaotic start to their day were more prepared for school and learning.

### **Training:** (£3000)

All teachers and TAs were given training on the differentiated input model to ensure children are given a highly focussed and appropriate teacher input at every lesson. This negated the need for children to be withdrawn from class in the morning sessions for interventions.

## **Results 2016**

### **Key Stage 1**
